LCDR Ryan P. Mitchell assumed command of U.S. Coast Guard Marine Safety Unit (MSU) Toledo, Ohio in July, 2024. MSU Toledo is responsible for executing the Coast Guard's Port Safety and Security, Marine Environmental Protection, and Commercial Vessel Safety missions with an assigned area of responsibility stretching from Vermillion, Ohio, to Monroe, Michigan along a 214-mile international border.

LCDR Mitchell commissioned in the United States Coast Guard in June 2013 through the Direct Commission Officer Maritime Graduate (MARGRAD) Program.

He recently served as the Direct Commission Officer Course Chief at the Coast Guard's Leadership Development Center, where he was solely responsible for planning and execution of all aspects of a critical officer accession program targeting

LCDR Mitchell has also served at Marine Safety Unit Texas City as an Apprentice Marine Inspector and Marine Safety Unit Port Arthur, where he served as a Journeyman Marine Inspector and Facilities Division Officer. He also holds master's degree in Management with a concentration in Organizational Leadership, and is currently pursuing a doctoral degree in Strategic Leadership.
